DUTY OF CARE

It is my duty to advise you:

That power boat racing can be dangerous, your equipment could be damaged or destroyed and you may suffer serious personal injury or worse

If there is any aspect of this race meeting that causes you concern for your personal safety or that of any member of your crew whether it be on the race course or the venue or the manner in which the meeting is being conducted:

It is your obligation to bring those concerns to the attention of the Officer of the Day. If after doing this those concerns are not addressed to your satisfaction you are advised to withdraw from this race meeting.

Does everybody understand his or her obligations and rights in this regard?

It is also my duty to advise you:

That the APBA insurance is a liability policy that covers your liability to the public and non competitors and that you and your equipment are not covered by any other form of insurance unless you have obtained separate insurance cover.

Scrutineering is a compliance check and the responsibility for the safety and mechanical condition of your boat and equipment is your own.

Random drug and alcohol testing may take place as well as boat/engine measuring for class compliance If you have any doubts about your ability to pass such a test or your boat not complying you should withdraw from this race meeting IMMEDIATELY
